

ARCH 151 Architectural Drawing I
IN CLASS SKETCH PROBLEM:
Lettering

Using the image at the right as a guide for proportions, practice hand-lettering the alphabet and numbers.
Draft parallel construction lines spaced at 1/4." Then try 1" spacing.

Use HB lead on a sheet of drawing paper from your large pad of paper. Your paper must be taped down. Use your mayline and a small triangle to create the verticals of each letter or number and freehand the curved and angled lines. This is your test page.

Letters must be capital block-style letters (no outlines, serifs or lowercase letters). After testing the technique, complete a final 9"x12" page to add to your Illustrated Dictionary.

Using guidelines, letter your name and date on the front of Project 1, Assignment 4 in the lower right-hand corner.

MINIMUM HEIGHT FOR ANY LETTERING IS 1/8".

MAJOR TITLES SHOULD BE 1/4" HIGH.
3/16" HEIGHT CAN BE USED FOR MINOR TITLES.
